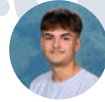


Our Student leadership

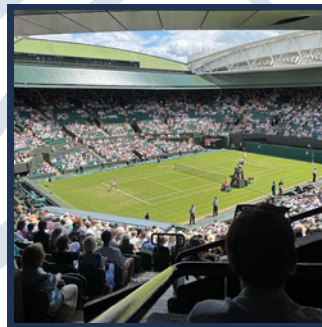

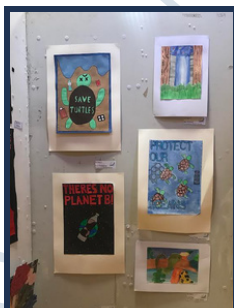
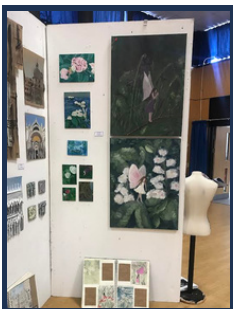
Summer Concert

Literacy Festival: Here be Monsters

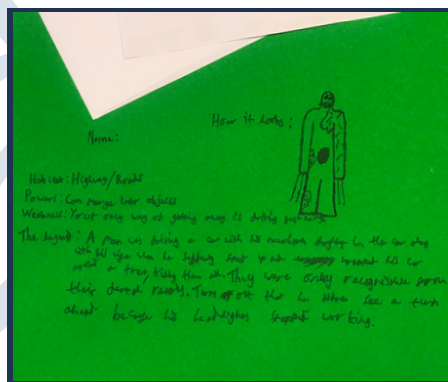
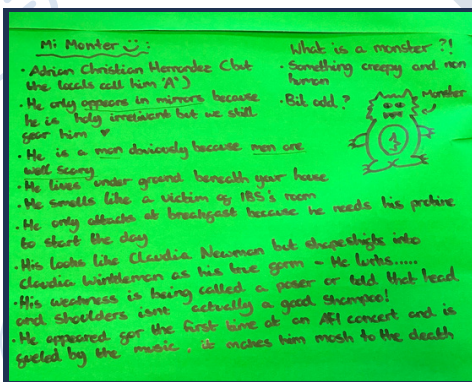

Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde

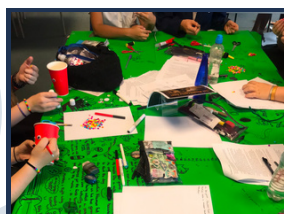
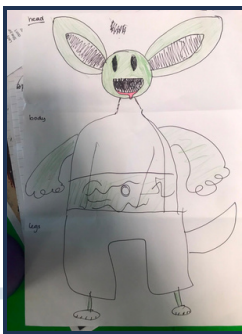
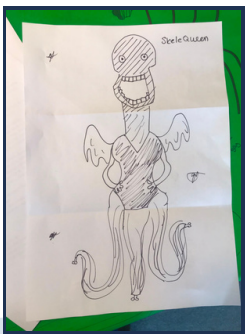

Nearing the end of the event, students created mix-and-match monsters as well as their own DIY puppets.

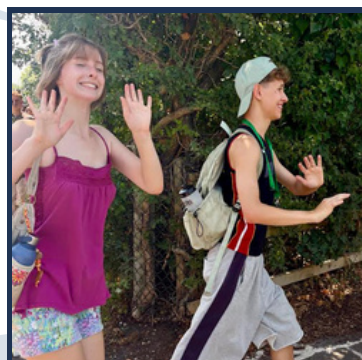
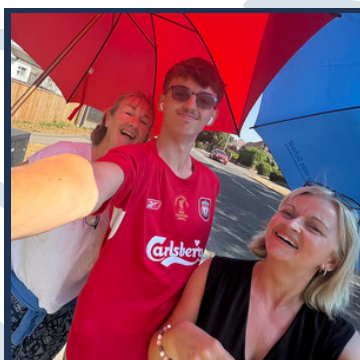
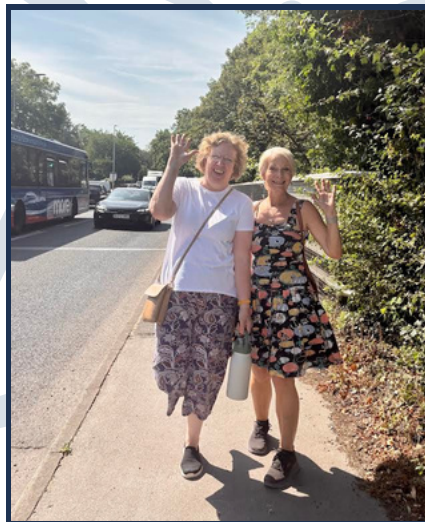
